A TRADITION OF CARING

When the Sisters of Providence arrived in the Pacific Northwest in 1856, they came to answer a call for help from a new pioneer community. What they found were many communities in need of service, and so with dedication and collaboration, they built the first schools, hospitals and orphanages in the West. Their ministry grew to what is now a five-state health system. We continue the tradition of caring that the sisters began nearly 160 years ago, always keeping in mind the most poor and vulnerable.

Our Mission: As people of Providence, we reveal God's love for all, especially the poor and vulnerable, through our compassionate service.

WHERE WE SERVE

Providence Health & Services is one of Montana's largest health care providers. With more than 40 clinics, two hospitals and 2,000 caregivers (all employees) statewide, we work together to provide quality care to those in need. Our not-for-profit network includes diverse community services across western Montana, including the University of Great Falls.

Providence in Montana is part of the third largest not-for-profit health system in the nation which also serves communities in Alaska, California, Oregon and Washington. Our combined scope of services include 34 hospitals, 475 physician clinics, long-term and assisted living, palliative and hospice care, home health, supportive housing and education. In 2014, Providence provided a total of \$848 million in community benefit.
